



2027 AVCAT SCHOLARSHIPS and LONG TAN BURSARY APPLICATION GUIDE

About the Long Tan Bursaries and Scholarships

AVCAT bursaries and sponsored scholarships support students who study full-time at an Australian university, TAFE, or registered training organisation. Scholarships provide financial assistance for up to three years and are awarded based on financial need, academic potential, and deservedness.

Long Tan Bursaries

Long Tan Bursaries are for the children and grandchildren of Vietnam Veterans and are funded by the Australian Government Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA). Each year, 37 bursaries are awarded to successful applicants across Australia.

Sponsored Scholarships

Sponsored scholarships are for the children and grandchildren of all ex-serving veterans and are funded by ex-service organisations, corporate and private donors [Click here](#) to see our sponsors.

Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility for Long Tan Bursaries and Sponsored Scholarship *

- Australian residency status
- Planning to enrol or enrolled in a tertiary course of study (recognised under the Australian Qualifications Framework) for one or more academic years at an Australian university, TAFE or a registered training organisation.
- Be studying or planning to study full-time, online or face-to-face. If an applicant is offered a scholarship or bursary but defers study, they are no longer eligible. Priority is given to those who have not previously undertaken tertiary education. Applicants who are seeking a scholarship for a second degree, or a graduate degree, Masters or Doctorate will be given lower priority.
- Be a child or a grandchild of an ex-serving veteran. Children include adopted children, ex-nuptial children, stepchildren and foster children. Stepchildren and foster children must have resided with, or been financially supported by, their veteran stepparent or foster parent for 5 of the last 10 years. Grandchildren are defined as the children of one's son or daughter. Step-grandchildren and foster grandchildren must have resided with or been financially supported by a person who is a child of a veteran for 5 of the last 10 years.
- The veteran must be an Australian ex-serving veteran with operational service including eligible war service, war-like service and peacekeeping/peacemaking service OR 3 or more continuous years of full-time other service, as a member of the

Australian Navy, Army or Air Force, OR served in an organisation during war-like situations which is recognised by DVA.

- People who are serving in the Reserve Forces (SERCAT 3, 4 & 5 – Rendering Service) are considered to be serving so the applicant child or grandchild is not eligible.

*** In addition, eligibility for the Long Tan Bursary include:**

- Be a child or grandchild of an Australian veteran who served in the Vietnam War during 31 July 1962 to 30 April 1975
- In receipt of, or eligible to receive, a means-tested Commonwealth educational benefit - Youth Allowance, ABSTUDY, Austudy or Veterans' Children Education Scheme (VCES) or Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Act Education and Training Scheme (MRCAETS).
- Have not previously received a Long Tan Bursary

*** In addition, eligibility for the Sponsored Scholarships include**

- Be able to demonstrate financial hardship on income and assets grounds
- Specific eligibility may apply to Sponsored Scholarships, such as born/living in a specific state/territory; membership of an association; course of study; veteran's service in a specific conflict/battalion or branch of the Australian Defence Force.

Applicants should only complete one application to be considered for the Long Tan Bursary and a Sponsored Scholarship. Applicants will be considered for all scholarships and bursaries for which they are eligible.

Important Information

- It is a requirement of the application to provide academic results, an academic reference, detailed financial information, and other supporting documents. If this information is not provided, an application cannot be considered.
- All scholarships and bursaries share common eligibility criteria. However, specific criteria may apply to individual scholarships, such as born/living in a specific state/territory/postcode; course of study, membership of a particular association; veteran's service was in a specific conflict/battalion/particular section of the Australian Defence Force, e.g. RAAF, SASR.
- Applications are assessed by independent assessors and AVCAT's National Selection Committee. To read more about assessment, visit our [website](#).
- The selection process is competitive, and scholarship numbers are limited; therefore, not all worthy and eligible applicants will receive a Long Tan Bursary or Sponsored Scholarship.
- Applicants are notified of the outcome of their application from late February through March.
- Applications that are not successful are retained for twelve months and then destroyed.

Completing the Online Application

Applications open on **18th August 2026** and are completed online at avcat.org.au. Applications, including all documentation, must be submitted by **midnight 31st October 2026**. The following information will assist you with the application process:

- Documents relating to the veteran, yourself, academic results, and finances may take time to collect. AVCAT recommends that you start finding the information required for the application well before the due date.
- You can save and exit the application at any point. By clicking the 'Save and Continue Later' button. If you 'Save and Continue," you will receive an email with a link to your partially completed application. Keep this email and link until you complete and finally submit your application.
- Once you submit your application, you will receive a confirmation email from AVCAT.

Information and Documents required for each section of the Application Form

Section 1: Eligibility

This section is to determine whether you are eligible to apply for an AVCAT scholarship and/or the Long Tan Bursary.

You are required to answer yes/no regarding:

- the Australian ex-serving veteran in your family and your relationship to the ex-serving veteran,
- your Australian residency status
- enrolment and study load at a tertiary institution,

Documentation required: N/A

Section 2: Contact Information

You are required to provide:

- contact information for the APPLICANT. This includes the APPLICANT's **email and phone number**. AVCAT will liaise with the APPLICANT throughout the application process. The email and phone must be monitored regularly, and responses for additional information are to be provided by the due date.
- how you found out about AVCAT and scholarships

Documentation required:

- applicant birth certificate

Section 3: Other Information

This section requires you to provide information about yourself, including whether you need to relocate for study (i.e. not living at home), your caring responsibilities, and previous applications.

Documentation required: N/A

Section 4: Veteran Details

You are required to provide details of:

- the ex-serving veteran under whom you are applying, their service history, and the relevant membership details of ex-serving organisations (e.g., a state/territory TPI organisation)
- other veterans in your family

Documentation required:

Veteran

- veteran service record (search here if required [Nominal Rolls](#))
- If the **veteran is the applicant's parent**, only the applicant's birth certificate is required, not the birth certificate of the veteran parent
- If the **veteran is the applicant's grandparent**, provide **both** the applicant's birth certificate, and the applicant's parents' birth certificate to show evidence of the applicant's connection to the veteran. The birth certificate of the veteran grandparent **is not** required.
- adoption certificate if applicable

Other Veterans in your family

- if the other veteran in your family served in Vietnam, please provide documentation as per above
- if the other veteran did not serve in Vietnam, no further documentation is required

Section 5: Family Details

You are required to:

- describe your current accommodation arrangements
- give details of your primary caregivers (e.g., parent/guardian), siblings, and dependents if applicable

Documentation required: N/A

Section 6: Academic Details

You are required to provide details of your current study circumstances, including:

- if you are currently a year 12 student, university/TAFE student, gap year student, mature aged student or working
- course or course preference
- expected ATAR, if applicable
- early offers, if applicable

Documentation required:

Academic results

- the previous **18 months'** results for the following:
 - o year 12 students – full school reports including teachers' comments
 - o University/TAFE students – unofficial academic transcript plus final year school report if within the last 18 months of study
 - o gap year students - year 12 full school reports including teacher's comments, students who have not been studying for over 1 year – employer report or Academic Reference required – refer below

Reference

- AVCAT Academic Reference Form:
 - o a current teacher/university tutor or lecturer who has supervised or taught you in the last 6 months is required to fill out the [AVCAT Reference Form](#). This form is located on our website located under Forms in the page footer.
 - o if you have not studied for over 12 months you can ask your employer or trainer to complete the AVCAT Reference Form
 - o the referee must be able to speak to your ability to complete your chosen course of study.

AVCAT provides a link to the online AVCAT Academic Reference Form which you share with your chosen referee. The referee completes and submits the form directly to AVCAT by the 31st of October and receives email confirmation that the reference has been submitted.

Section 7: Financial Details

In this section, you are required to give details of the following:

Applicant (and applicant partner if applicable)

- government benefits/pensions received
- other support or allowances received (e.g., rental assistance or child support)
- other scholarships or potential scholarships
- a list of assets/liabilities
- financial assets such as investment property, land, and business interests
- fortnightly income after tax

Applicant Parents/Guardians

If you are under 22 years old as of 28 February 2027, your parents/guardians are required to provide the following:

Note: If your parents are separated, only your primary caregiver details (and their partner if applicable) are required:

- government benefits/pensions received
- other support or allowances received (e.g., rental assistance or child support)
- a list of assets/liabilities
- financial assets such as investment property, trusts, land, and business interests
- fortnightly income after tax

Documentation required:

Applicant (and applicant partner if applicable)

- most recent evidence of all government benefits received (e.g., Centrelink statement, VCES, MRCAETS advice)
- a **full** tax return with **all supporting schedules** for the year ended 30 June 2026
- a copy of your last two payslips for June 2026
- your notice of assessment (NOA) from ATO for 30 June 2026
- your superannuation statement for 30 June 2026

To print copies of your full tax return and NOA use the ATO online services and myGov.

Applicant Parents/Guardians

If you are under 22 years as of 28 February 2027 your parents/guardians are required to provide the following:

Note: If your parents are separated, only your primary caregiver details (and their partner if applicable) are required.

- Evidence of **all** government benefits received by parents/guardians indicating the type and amount of each payment
- full tax returns with **all supporting schedules** for 30 June 2026
- last two payslips for 30 June 2026
- notice of assessment (NOA) from ATO for 30 June 2026
- superannuation statement for 30 June 2026

A **full tax return** is a multi-page document that includes all income and claimable expenses during the financial year. See the 4-page sample below
